

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our parish is celebrating a great occasion: one of our native sons has been ordained a deacon. God willing, he will be ordained to the holy priesthood next May. Deacon Michael Scanga grew up at St. Joseph Church. He attended school at St. Joseph School, Kennedy Catholic High School, and Franciscan University of Steubenville. He entered the seminary for the Diocese of Erie in 2019, spending two years at St. Mark Seminary (part of Gannon University) before he was sent by Bishop Persico to St. Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, where he has been studying for the past 3 years.

During his year as a deacon, his formal title is "Reverend Mister" Michael Scanga (it can be abbreviated "Rev. Mr." or "Reverend Mr.) - a title that's really only used on the front of envelopes. "Deacon Scanga" or "Deacon Michael" are the more common styles of address.

The diaconate was instituted by the apostles to assist in the administration of the Church (Acts 6). In today's church, a deacon is able to give a blessing (in certain circumstances), baptize infants, solemnize weddings (if the wedding occurs outside of a Mass), preside over funerals (also outside of Mass), and preach homilies.

Deacon Scanga will be deaconing at the 11:00 am Mass this Sunday, April 14, and giving the homily. There will be a light reception after Mass downstairs in the Guild Hall. Please come if you are able. If you would like to give Deacon Scanga a card, but forgot to bring it this week, you can drop it off at the parish or put it in the basket and I will be sure that it gets to him.

Deacon Scanga has been assigned by Bishop Persico to help out at St. James Church in Erie while he is home from school. He will be spending the summer there and will be expected to help there for Christmas and Easter. We will be grateful to have him help out a bit at our parish when he gets the occasional break.

Please continue to keep Deacon Scanga in your prayers as he spends this year preparing for his ordination to the priesthood.
